



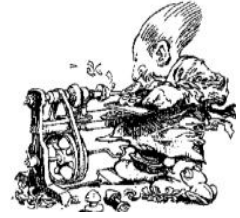

If you are coming from the south:

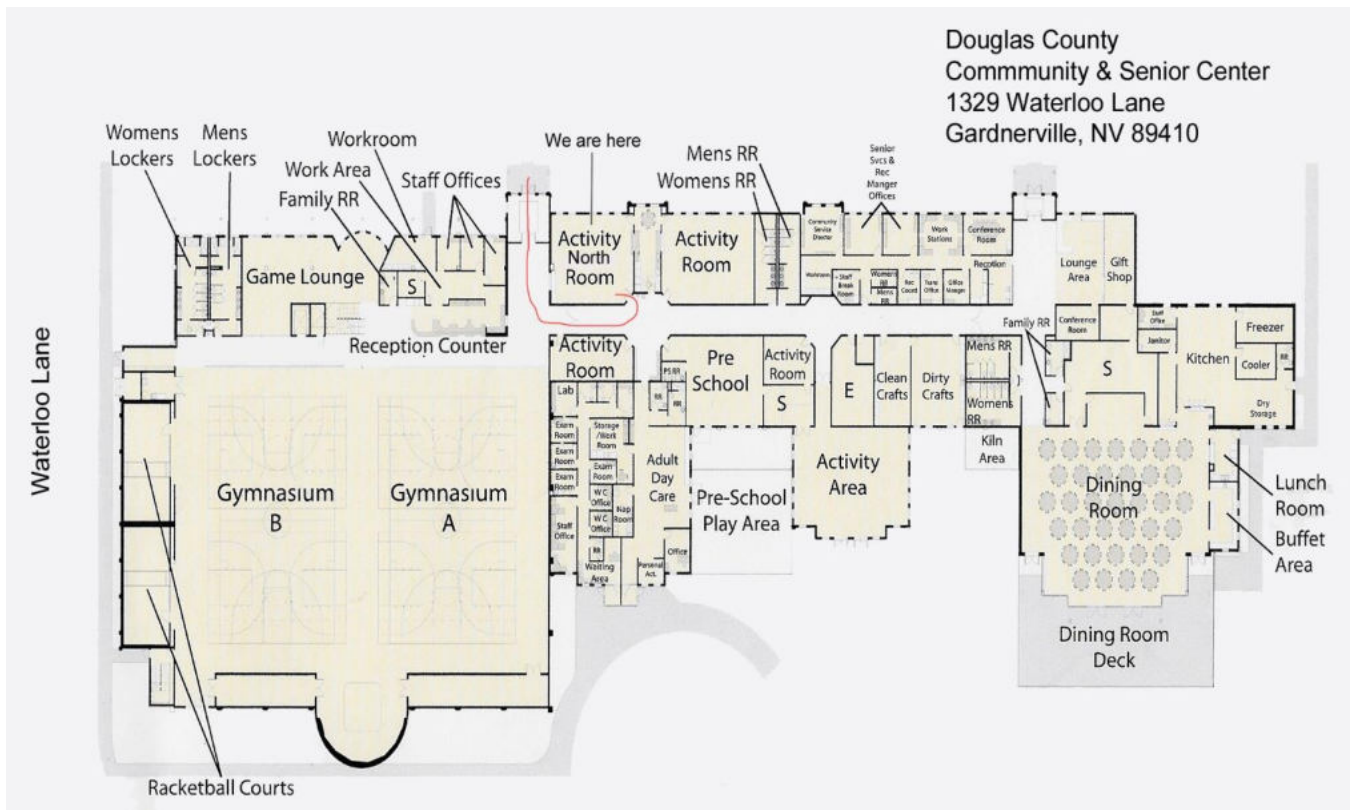
