

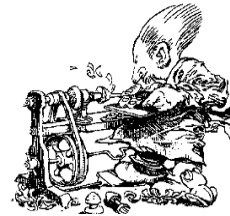

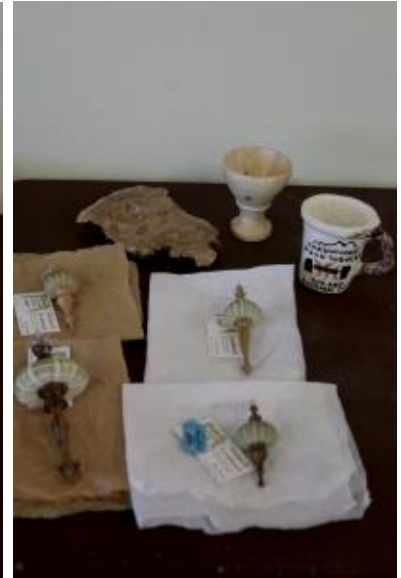

Charcoal White Pencil

Pencil marks on dark wood seem to disappear unless you have a bright light and just the right working angle. That combination is not always possible to keep when you're trying to make an accurate cut. I've tried chalk, grease pencils, fabric markers, and a few other light-colored markers. None of these worked to my liking. On a recent project I needed to do some precise carving in black walnut. I drew out my pattern in



pencil and set down to start carving and, surprise, surprise I couldn't see what I had just drawn. I tried the same old bunch of light-colored markers with no luck. Off to do a little online shopping. I lucked out and found charcoal white drawing pencils in a two pack for \$6.50. They work well and can be seen without any special light angle tricks. In the photo you can see it used on walnut and cocobolo.

The center is a short way down Waterloo Lane on the left (look for the big flag) just before the skate park and opposite Lampe Park.

We are in the north end of the building (closest to the street) in the North Activity Room.
